EXECUTIVE ORDER }
No. 48. }

Upon recommendation of the Honorable, the Secretary of Commerce and Police, the custodianship of all occupied public buildings is hereby transferred from the Director of Public Works to the respective Bureaus concerned, as follows:

The Intendencia Building, to the Bureau of Audits; the Anloague Museum Building, to the Bureau of Science; the Old Army and Navy Club Building, to the Philippine Library and the Bureau of Agriculture, each to the extent of parts thereof occupied by them; the Oriente Building, to the Bureau of Constabulary; the Mint Building, to the Bureau of Education; the Audiencia Building, to the Supreme Court, and Mr. J. McMicking, clerk of the Court of First Instance of Manila, is hereby designated custodian thereof; the Augustinian Building, to the Bureau of Public Works; and the Potenciana Building, to the Bureau of Civil Service. The janitor service for each of the buildings above mentioned shall be provided by the respective Bureaus concerned. The Director of Public Works shall remain, in accordance with paragraph (c) of section thirteen of Act Numbered Fourteen hundred and seven, the custodian of all vacant Insular buildings.

This order shall take effect on July first, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
